# Get Information

The first step is to get information on all parties involved in the accident. Here's a list of facts you need to collect:

- Get the full name and complete contact information, including the phone number.
- Ask for the insurance company's name and policy number.
- Do not make any statements about the accident to anyone else at the scene except the police officers.
- Check the driver's license and license plate number.
- Make a note of the model name, type, and color of the car involved.
- Ensure you know the precise location of the accident. You can mark it in software programs like Google Maps.

This information can be vital for the success of the case. It will help us collect evidence and witness' statements to support your argument.

# Get The Documents Related To The Accident

If you don't need urgent medical attention, are waiting for medical help, or can move around, it is crucial to collect information at the scene. Here's how you can document the accident:

- Take clear pictures of the accident site, vehicle, your injuries, the injuries of your passengers and also the damages to the other car
- Collect the name and badge numbers from police officers present at the scene.
- Get a copy of the accident report from the officer.
- Write down the names and contact information of witnesses to the accident.

All of these are physical proof of the accident and will hold a lot of weight in court. We always encourage patients to focus on their health and well being first before attempting to collect documentation.
